Watch What God Will Do

I wonder what's going to happen today? When I traveled to India last month I barely knew what was going to happen each day. When I did ask for a 'head's up' about the day it seemed more difficult to explain than to just be patient and just wait and see. We flew into Delhi and also flew to Surat and Varanasi. In each place we met with pastors, visited schools, churches and training centers. The experience in Varanasi was probably the highlight as we traveled with area pastors to a village on the outskirts of the city.

As usual, I didn't know what was in store and patiently waited to be told where to go next. We got out of our vehicles, stood around awhile (that happened frequently) and then were directed to a concrete building that was about 20' x 40'. This was a church that ICM (International Cooperating Ministries) built. We entered in the middle of singing and sharing testimonies and were ushered to the front where we sat in plastic white chairs. The four of us with ICM were asked to share 'something'. I had journaled that morning from the book of Esther and shared that God had brought us there on this particular day to encourage them *'for such a time as this'*. Who knows how God used our messages, but we trust that they encouraged the congregation.

We then traveled a bit further to another church...maybe twice as big and four times as many people. Again, we were escorted into the church and asked to sit up front in plastic white chairs. Everyone else sat on the floor. At this point the temperature probably reached over 105 degrees. Sweat was seeping through our clothes. Our host passed out napkins to wipe our faces. I went through about five. A few of us shared messages and testimonies...through a translator. And then the highlight of the day...we witnessed the baptism of over 100 people.



Mike, from Indianapolis, got to participate by stepping into the cool waters and immersed dozens of people as he asked them if they trusted in Jesus as their Lord and Savior and if they wanted to repent of their sins. I observed that after each person was baptized they had to step down three concrete steps, so I jumped in and helped each person safely to level ground.


100 people! And that was not just one day, but the churches in this area are baptizing over 100 people EVERY DAY! What is God doing in India? New churches are starting and whole villages are coming to Christ. I


asked one pastor what was attracting people to Christianity and he said it was the promise of peace between them and God. In a country with the religion of Hinduism which claims some 33 million gods, Hinduism never promises peace, only that Nirvana might be reached if they, perhaps, live a righteous life. Otherwise, they return to earth in this eternal cycle of reincarnation.

We worship the same God that's saving people in India right here in Virginia. Let's pray that God will begin a revival in Goochland county. Imagine a service where we baptize even one new believer. May He bring a new awakening to us as we represent Him at 1040 Shallow Well.

Courage Fueled by Praise

Thomas Ken (1637-1710)

Glorify the Lord with me, let us exalt his name together. I sought the Lord, and he answered me, he delivered me from all my fears. ~ Psalm 34: 3-4

Across the world many churches sing one particular song of praise every Sunday. In just a few lines it summarizes great themes of the Christian faith.

> Praise God, from whom all blessings flow; Praise Him, all creatures here below; Praise Him above, ye heavenly host; Praise Father, Son and Holy Ghost

> > Who wrote these words?

Thomas Ken was a prominent Anglican clergyman in an age when the English nobility was not known for its saintliness. More than once he felt compelled to remain true to his conscience, even when that meant disagreeing with or opposing the King.

In one instance, when James II became king in 1688, Thomas Ken's convictions cost him his freedom. Now a bishop, Ken and several others refused to endorse or enforce the King's Declaration of Indulgence. James threw the bishops in prison in the Tower of London. Eventually tried and acquitted, Ken returned home to a quiet retirement.

This story shows a man of great wisdom and courage, who was unwilling to compromise his conscience. I like to think that Ken's courage was fueled by the praise that was on his lips. You see, years before this royal encounter, he'd written the lines we now know as the Doxology. He wrote them as a "last verse" for several hymns sung at the Winchester Cathedral. Note that I said "several hymns". He didn't want the words sung just once. He wanted this praise to be repeated at services in the morning, afternoon and night.

Do you feel in need of courage to take a stand? You can find that courage in an intimate relationship with the true King "from whom all blessings flow." This hymn also looks at Stewardship season as not only a time of planning and preparation, but also a time to reflect on how richly God has blessed us at Hebron. Praise Him for His blessings! Look to Him to lift your fear and empower you to act on what is right.
