Telling Your Easter Story

"God hold you in this turning, Christ warm you through this night, Spirit breathe its ancient rhythm, Peace give your sorrows flight." Jan L. Richardson

Richard Morgan uses this snippet of poetry to open the first chapter of his book, <u>Remembering</u> <u>Your Story: Creating Your Own Spiritual Autobiography</u>. Morgan's book has helped many over the years who've wanted to connect-the-dots of the events of their lives in order to see patterns of God's artistry in their spiritual journeys. Morgan believes the need to collect and remember our stories is more urgent than ever:

"American life and culture are changing so fast that older people realize that their grandchildren have no idea of the events that shaped their lives. And more and more mid-lifers are realizing that with the increased mobility of modern life, family stories that once were passed down orally will be lost if not preserved."

Morgan helps the reader think of his or her life as a river, recognizing the "tributaries" that have fed us, and noting times when the river of our life has helped to nourish others. When has your "river" been fast and turbulent? When has it been slow and meandering? When has it been quiet and deep? And in every part of the "river" of your life, where have you recognized God's grace? Morgan helps us to claim our "stories" and to see how they interconnect to form the larger story of our human life.

It's been said that "the greatest story ever told" is that of Jesus Christ, as related to us in the four Gospels of our New Testament. The story of Jesus is truly "great" because of what God accomplished through it; coming into the world in the person of Jesus of Nazareth, teaching us and showing us love, and dying a death for our sinfulness that grants us the hope of forgiveness and eternal life.

During the remainder of the Lenten season leading up to Easter, we'll be telling that story again at Hebron Church. Beginning on Palm Sunday and continuing through Maundy Thursday and Easter Sunday, we'll remember again the suffering and sacrifice of Jesus Christ, and we'll celebrate once again God's glorious resurrection of Jesus when his friends and family and followers thought his story had ended. The good news for the story of your life is that no matter how deep or dark certain stretches of your "river" have been, you've never been truly alone; and when we place ourselves in the hands of the great Navigator, we find that our Lord is trustworthy not only to bring us safely through, but to give meaning to our hardest times.

SESSION SUMMARY

Stated Meeting of Session March 21, 2019

- Deacon chair Scott Parks updated the session on Wi-fi upgrades at the church and requested approval to move forward in providing wireless internet access to the Parrish House via a point -to-point connection with the main church campus, at a cost of \$860. Session approved this request, with cost to be covered through the church's building fund. Recent cost saving opportunities at the church have more than compensated for this expense.
- Elder Carol Mittendorff reported on behalf of the Worship Committee that plans are underway for an early worship service and breakfast at Hebron on Easter Sunday, April 21st. This will be a shared service with Dover Baptist Church. Hebron will also hold its regular 10:00 a.m. service on Easter Sunday.
- Elder Mittendorff brought a request on behalf of the Christian Education Committee to make it a matter of record that oversight of materials used in educational programs of Hebron Church is granted to the Director of Christian Education. This has been the practice, but it was uncertain whether this had been made a matter of record. Session approved this request, adding that quarterly reports should be provided by the DCE to the session.
- Elder Nancy Michael reported on behalf of the Missions Committee that to date, \$4,483 had been raised through Hebron Church for the Niger Cooperative Project, and \$11,000 had been raised for the Niger Bible College. The Missions Committee also plans to hold a food drive for Goochland Cares in April.
- Elder Mack Curle brought a proposal for accessibility improvements on the church campus, to be funded in the amount of up to \$20,000 by the Cemetery Committee. Session approved the proposal, which will include concrete pads for handicapped parking near the sanctuary and the education building, improvement to the handicapped entrance between the pastor's office and the sanctuary, creation of a landing below the rear entrance to the sanctuary and construction of a sidewalk connecting that landing with the one at the rear entrance of the kitchen. Additionally, needed adjustments will be made to several of the headstones in the cemetery.
- The session heard the faith statements of the seven 2019 confirmands and received them into church membership. The 2019 confirmands are Garrett Eastwood, Grace Kistler, Jack Miller, Reed Miller, Perry Nuckols, Mason Smith, and Frances Thackston,
- Action taken via email since the February stated meeting was reported for the record:
 --A motion was approved on March 14th to allow the Goochland Historical Society to use Holman Hall for their April 7th meeting.



<u>Reflections on our Great Hymns</u> by Markus Compton

Take My Life and Let It Be

Author: Frances R. Havergal (1836-1879)

It was said of Frances Ridley Havergal, author of this text, that the beauty of a consecrated life was never more perfectly revealed than in her daily living. She has rightfully been called 'The Consecration Poet". As a hymn-writer she is recognized as being, in a special sense, the singer of consecration. Her hymns belong to what has been called "the hymnody of Christian experience". Her verses glow with spiritual warmth and speak to the heart. Many of her hymns are still in use, especially in evangelical circles. They express her radiant faith and deep devotion to Christ. Some of her hymns include, 'Lord, speak to me, that I may speak'; 'Like a river glorious'; and 'Take My Life' to name but a few.

Although never enjoying robust health, she pursued a very active life until the age of thirty-seven, when a severe attack of typhoid fever laid her low for the better part of a year. Other illnesses followed, and in her later years she was obliged to restrict some of her activities; but she was ceaselessly busy with her pen almost to the day of her death.

'Take My Life and Let It Be' is one of Havergal's best-known hymns. It has twelve couplets; the first of them is general and introduces the theme of the consecrated life. The ten that follow are specific and deal in turn with those elements of the personality that are involved in true consecration. The final couplet integrates these into one, namely, the consecrated self. Each couplet begins with the word Take, and this is a key to the interpretation of the hymn. When we use it as a prayer we are offer ourselves; all we are and all we have, to the Lord for His acceptance and use. It is for Him to decide what that use shall be. Our part is to place ourselves unreservedly at His disposal; to make our various gifts of body, mind, and spirit available for His service. This is the full meaning of consecration.

In this day of self-centered living and pleasure-oriented lifestyle, the total commitment to God of body, mind, and possessions portrayed in this text is difficult for many to understand, let alone achieve! Even though we realize that we have nothing we have not received and that we are only stewards of the good gifts God has entrusted to us, we often fail to apply this basic truth to our daily lives. During this Lenten season, may we once again express our gratitude for all of God's gifts and dedicate ourselves more completely to His glory and service.


