On the Words of Saints

It's my privilege to be speaking to you from this position, as your new pastor. I'm delighted to be in Manakin-Sabot, and I have appreciated the warm welcome I've received at Hebron Presbyterian Church. It's my hope to serve you faithfully for a good while, as we all seek to serve our Lord, together.

I was having a conversation the other day with one of Hebron's faithful. We were discussing, among other things, ancestry and this area's history. The conversation called to mind my maternal grandfather, who looms large in influence in my life, even following his death some years ago, just days before his 100th birthday. My paternal grandfather died before I was born, and in hindsight I can see that my mother's father made an extra effort with my sister and me, knowing that he was the only grandfather we had.

I've often wondered what it is that makes the things that certain people say to us stand out so vividly in our memories. I distinctly remember the day my grandfather said, "Connie, there are two things you need to understand about the Church; one is the importance of *unity*; and the other is the *priesthood of the believer*." For my grandfather, these two principles existed in tension with one another, and yet were both elemental in the healthy functioning of a congregation. The "priesthood of the believer" means that each of us has both the right and the responsibility to study and interpret the Scriptures for ourselves, and to come to our own understanding of them. The principle of unity means that in the midst of practicing "priesthood of the believer," we find a way to remain unified as we keep our shared focus on the person of Jesus Christ.

This lesson from my grandfather guides my practice of ministry. The Church is deeper, richer, more engaging, and more fruitful, when each of us takes seriously our right and our responsibility to study the Scriptures for ourselves, and to ask God's Holy Spirit to guide us as we seek to understand them in the context of Christian community. Then we use what God is teaching us, to draw us into closer and more genuine fellowship with one another, in the name of Jesus Christ.

I expect as time goes on, you'll hear more from me about my Grandpa Hoke. When my grandfather died just short of turning 100 years old, the family already had a party planned for his big birthday. With gratitude for his life, we had his 100th birthday party, anyway!

Many blessings to you on your journey of Christian faith.

Session Notes Stated Meeting February 15, 2018

- The session approved a motion to invite the president of the Evangelical Church of Niger (EERN) to speak during worship on July 8th. The Rev. Mai-aiki Kadade will be visiting in Richmond, and Hebron's session is delighted to have this opportunity to welcome him to worship in July.
- 2. Howard Curle was elected to a three-year term as treasurer of Hebron PC. He was also named executive account manager for church and day school checking accounts, as well as church brokerage accounts.
- 3. The 2018 church budget was amended from the version approved in October, to reflect a 4.7% increase; from \$309,015 to \$323,599.
- 4. A special offering for tuition assistance for the Hebron Day School was approved, for a date to be determined.
- 5. A youth mission fund-raiser was approved for March 25th, 2018, to consist of a pancake brunch after worship on Palm Sunday, and a silent auction for members to bid on youth services such as grass cutting, babysitting, etc.
- Elder Ronnie Nuckols reported that Hebron PC was recently recognized in a Frontier Fellowship publication, for the church's support of education in Niger. Individuals in our congregation support 23 students at a Niger school.
- 7. Other recent action by Hebron's session includes approval of A Service of Installation for Connie Weaver on Sunday, March 4th, at 3 o'clock; approval to allocate proceeds from the recent "Souper Bowl" offering to the 2018 youth mission trip; acceptance of the 2017 Annual Statistical Report to be submitted to Presbytery of the James; and approval of a gift of \$2,500 to Allen and Tracy Pickett in appreciation of their service and presence at Hebron Presbyterian Church.

The Installation Service for Rev. Connie Weaver will be held Sunday, March 4 at 3:00pm. The Rev. Clay Macaulay will deliver the sermon. Rev. Macaulay is the Director of Alumni Development at Union Presbyterian Seminary. There will be a reception immediately following the service.

GIVING GOD ALL THE GLORY

FRANZ JOSEPH HAYDN (1832-1809)

So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, "We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty." Luke 17: 10

On March 27, 1808, Franz Joseph Haydn attended his last musical performance. The program featured his oratorio *The Creation*. He'd finished the massive work at age sixty-six, saying it had been composed to inspire "the adoration and worship of the Creator" and to put the listener "In a frame of mind where he is most susceptible to the kindness and omnipotence of the Creator."

Haydn recalled, "Never was I so devout as when I composed *The Creation*. I knelt down each day to pray to God to give me strength for my work." He told a friend, "When I was working on *The Creation*, I felt so filled with Divine certainty that, before sitting down to the piano, I would quietly and confidently pray to God to grant me the talent that was needed to praise Him worthily."

At this March 1808 performance of his triumphant oratorio, the composer was determined that God would get all the glory for his work. As the music faded and the audience applauded enthusiastically, Haydn lifted his hands and said, "Not from me – from there, above comes everything."

Haydn always insisted that his talents were an unmerited gift from God – a gift that he should use to bless others. He told a group of musicians playing his *Creation*, "There are so few happy and contented people here below, sorrow and anxiety pursue them from everywhere; perhaps your work may, someday, become a spring from which the careworn may draw a few moments rest and refreshment."

Haydn was well aware that he possessed talent at the genius level, but he always was quick to acknowledge the Author of his talent. Even his last will and testament begins: "In the Name of The Most Holy Trinity," and continues, "My soul I bequeath to its all-bountiful Creator."

It is all too easy to take the credit for the work we have done and to forget the Creator who enabled us to do the work. Our talents, our character, our knowledge, even our health are gifts from God, and to Him alone be all the glory.


