Our Debts and our Debtors

Years ago, New Testament scholar F.F. Bruce wrote a book called, <u>Hard Sayings of Jesus</u>. It's been a long time since I read the book, and so I don't remember all the "hard sayings" Bruce discusses; but one that's on my own list is some words of Jesus found in the 6th chapter of Matthew. They come in the context of Jesus' teaching about prayer. Matthew tells us that Jesus taught against praying just to be "seen" by others, and against heaping up empty phrases in our prayers. Matthew then gives us his rendering of what would come to be known as the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And do not bring us to the time of trial, but rescue us from the evil one.

Matthew 6:9b-13, NRSV

And then, Matthew tells us that Jesus spoke these words: For if you forgive others their trespasses, Your heavenly Father will also forgive you; but if you do not forgive others, neither will Your Father forgive your trespasses. If ever there was a "hard saying" of Jesus, this is certainly one of them. How many of us harbor ill feelings against another person? How many of us live with resentment toward someone we feel has wronged us, or who has wronged a person we love? Often, the unforgiveness we carry around inside of us is toward an individual we don't even know, or perhaps even toward a group of people. Sometimes, the grudge we bear may even be against God, over things we feel God could have done, but didn't.

Forgiveness is a delicate thing. It can't be forced. It's not honest to say that we've forgiven someone, if we actually haven't. Saying we've forgiven someone when we haven't done so seems to fall in that same category of praying to be seen, and heaping up empty phrases, that Jesus speaks against in regard to prayer. So, what are we to do with the grudges and resentments that are like weights that we carry?

I see forgiveness as an ongoing process in our lives. I believe that it's truly only God's empowerment through the Holy Spirit that enables us to forgive. The more we are able to understand ourselves as beloved by God, the more we are able to see others in the same way, even those who have hurt us. I've come to understand Jesus' words in Matthew 6:14 as a layered process, maybe even as a dance of sorts, in which we continually seek to forgive others as we continually seek forgiveness from God.

The truth is, I have an "aspirational forgiveness list." It's not terribly long, but it is persistent. I have to keep putting these people before God, asking God to help me love them, and pray for them, and yes, to forgive them. I trust that by acknowledging to God my need to forgive – by getting up out of my chair to dance, if you will – I will experience God's forgiveness of my own trespasses and be empowered to forgive others.

Inspired by God's Handiwork

Ludwig van Beethoven

Let the rivers clap their hands, let the mountains sing together for joy. ~Psalm 98:8

A young boy named Michael Krenn walked through the outskirts of Vienna, Austria looking for the strange man who had employed his father as his assistant. As the youth mounted a hill, he spied someone far away sitting by a brook. Yes, the boy knew that he had found his man.

Krenn later reported the bizarre scene: Jumping up from his seat on the ground, the eccentric "cried out, threw his hands about, walked fast, very slow and then very fast and then, all of a sudden, would stand quite still and write something in a kind of pocket notebook." The 'character'—Ludwig van Beethoven—was composing in his favorite 'studio'—the forest and fields of the great Vienna woods

Nature was always one of Beethoven's greatest inspirations. For years his typical daily schedule included two long walks in the country, where he composed many of the masterpieces we still cherish. One of his good friends claimed that he had "never met anyone who so delighted in nature, or who so thoroughly enjoyed flowers, or clouds, or other natural objects. Nature was almost meat and drink to him; he seems positively to exist on it."

Many diary excerpts describe Beethoven's love of nature. In 1812 he wrote: "Almighty One, in the woods I am blessed. Happy is everyone in the woods. Every tree speaks through Thee, O God! What glory is in the woodland. On the heights is peace—'Peace to serve Him.'" And in another entry he wrote, "Here I shall learn to know God and find a foretaste of heaven in His knowledge." No matter what the weather, Beethoven would wander through the fields, sketchbook in hand, awaiting inspiration. One of his favorite sayings was, "The morning air has gold to spare."

Perhaps the greatest example of nature's inspiration to Beethoven is his Symphony No. 6, the 'Pastoral' Symphony. Each of its five exquisite movements has a descriptive programmatic title, such as "Cheerful Impressions Excite on Arriving in the Country," "By the Brook," "Peasants Merry Making," "Storm," "The Shepherd's Hymn, Gratitude and Thanksgiving After the Storm."

Even after he was deaf, Beethoven held onto the inspiration he had found in the beauty of God's world. His love of nature brought him closer to the Lord, for he was careful to worship the Creator rather than the creation.

Our creator God delights in our delight of the creation He called "good." In our fast-paced world, we too often take nature for granted. When was the last time you were inspired by a sunset, a tree, a flower, a grand canyon—or a rolling stream?

In Isaiah 55:12, the poetry of scripture talks about nature itself praising God. "You will go out with joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and hills will burst into song before you and all the trees of the field will clap their hands." May we this season praise God for creating such an awesome world and may we catch a little of the Beethoven spirit being inspired by the sights and sounds of His handiwork.


