To Such as These

"Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." Luke 18:16-17, NRSV

A pastor friend of mine who works in another state recently shared an experience that occurred during the Lord's Supper at his church. In the congregation he serves, communion is taken by small groups gathering around the table in turns and passing the communion elements to one another. This pastor encourages each person, as the elements are passed, to say, "This is the Body of Christ" and "This is the Cup of Salvation," or other appropriate words of welcome and grace. Young children are included in this, so that they learn the practice and the language of the Lord's Supper.

On a recent Sunday, it so happened that a four-year-old girl was positioned to pass the communion bread to a 90-year-old who was standing beside her. She knew she was supposed to say something as she passed the bread. This little girl looked at the wizened elder beside her and pronounced, "You are a child of God." As my pastor friend described it, "Everyone melted." "This child had heard herself called this so many times, that it was what she wanted to say at the table, because those words meant something to her." The pastor saw this as a testimony to the fact that what we do and say in regard to the children in our midst, really does matter. Not only does this little girl already know herself to be a child of God, but she understands that it's true as well for those of us who are no longer "children," no matter how old we may be.

The 16th century reformer Martin Luther, who struggled so mightily with the concept of grace, is said to have placed his hand on his head every morning to remind himself of his baptism; to remind himself that his salvation came only from the grace of God in Christ, and not through any worthiness of his own. One of the greatest of the Protestant reformers needed to remind himself each day that he was wholly dependent upon God, as a child is dependent on the care and discipline of a loving parent. When you and I acknowledge the love and mercy of God in Jesus Christ, we begin to understand the glorious privilege of being grafted onto the Body of Christ as part of the family of God. We are received into the family, not because we are worthy, but because we are needful, and willing to acknowledge that need before God.

How would your days be different, if you started each one of them by reminding yourself that you are – before and above all else – a child of God? How would your relationships with others be different if you reminded yourself daily that every person you encounter – no matter how broken or imperfect – is also a "child" who is deeply desired in the family of God? *"Let the little children come to me,"* Jesus said. *"For it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs."*

SESSION SUMMARY Stated Meeting September 19th, 2019

- The Session received reports from its committees, including a curriculum update from Director of Christian Education Lori Alford, and a project list from John Miller on behalf of Building & Grounds. The B&G project list was compiled to assist the Session in prioritizing funding for upcoming repairs and improvements to the church property.
- An Asking Budget for 2020 was approved, to be distributed in early October with stewardship materials. Next year's church budget will be finalized following Commitment Sunday on October 13th, 2019.
- The Session voted to call a congregational meeting for Sunday, September 29th, immediately following worship, for the purpose of electing a nominating committee to secure officer nominees for new deacon and elder terms beginning in January 2020.
- Session members reviewed a proposed site for creation of an open green space on church property. A plan was submitted by Fayette Thackston on behalf of volunteers who have agreed to perform the work. The Session approved the plan in principle, requesting that the space be as large as possible within a quarter acre. The green space will be located adjacent to the side lawn of the Parrish House, to be accessible for youth recreation, church events, and use by the Day School. Work will proceed when ground conditions are good for tree removal, and will be paid for from an appropriate fund under advisement of the church treasurer.

OTHER ACTION

On August 31st, a motion was approved via email to proceed with needed replacement of old sanctuary duct work, to be paid for from the church's Building Fund.

The next stated meeting of Session will be on Thursday, October 17th, 2019.



Coming Home to Jesus Frederic Chopin (1810-1849)

Repent, then and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord. ~Acts 3:19

Pianist-composer Frederic Chopin, raised by loving, devoutly Christian parents, grew up having a sincere faith and love for the Lord. After he had left Poland for a musical career in Western Europe, his parents wrote him constantly, assuring him, "Your father and mother live to support you and pray God every day to bless and keep you."

But far from home, amid a hundred new and enticing influences, the young musician succumbed to the temptations of the high life. Giving one successful concert after another, he became the darling of the Paris salons. He was simply not spiritually equipped to handle the fast track to fame; news of his unhealthy habits and relationships, including a long liaison with the woman who wrote novels under the name "George Sands," grieved his distant parents—who kept praying. And God heard their fervent prayers. Chopin eventually turned away from Sands and many other questionable influences. Throughout his European travels Chopin had never forgotten his upbringing in Poland, and toward the end of his life, cut short by pulmonary tuberculosis, he sent for his childhood friend Abbe Jelowicki, who had entered the priesthood. This man's providential emergence saved Chopin's soul. After the two spent much time together, his old friend helped guide Chopin back to Christ.

Jelowicki remembered the jubilation that Chopin felt after reaffirming his faith: "Patience, trust in God, even joyful confidence, never left him, despite all his sufferings, 'til his last breath. He was really happy and called himself happy. Amid the sharpest sufferings he expressed only ecstatic joy and thankfulness that he had been led back to God."

At the age of thirty-nine, Chopin was on his deathbed. Jelowicki stayed with him through that last physical struggle, which lasted four days. When he sensed a final crisis, Chopin noticed the many people in the room with him. Turning to Jelowicki, he gasped, "Why do they not pray?" At these words, it is reported that all fell on their knees in prayer.

What joy God must have felt at the return of His son—like the exhilaration of the Prodigal Son's father: *"We had to celebrate and be glad, because this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found."* (Luke 15:32)

Who are you in this story? Are you Chopin, who ecstatically returned to the Lord? Are you his parents, ardently praying for a straying loved one? Are you Jelowicki, who showed his concern by boldly sharing his faith and leading his friend to the Lord? Whatever our part, let us never forget the supreme importance of sharing the joy of our salvation with others and may we remain steadfast in prayer for those who wander from God's side, for *"There is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents." (Luke 15:10)*


