## CHANGING LIVES

Lack of education is a serious problem in Niger. The Evangelical Church of Niger has a reputation for providing some of the best education in the nation through a small network of six schools. \$200 a year will send a child to school for an entire year. The school in Niamey grew from 47 students in 2017 to 360 in 2018. A matching grant between Hebron and the Frontier Fellowship allowed two additional classrooms to be built in 2019. The short term goal is to provide a basic education for children. The long term goal is to train disciples of Jesus Christ who will transform the nation of Niger by entering every facet of the society.

## NIGER CHILD EDUCATION



Hebron's Niger Child Education mission partners with the Evangelical Church of the Republic of Niger. This partnership is facilitated by the Frontier Fellowship (www.frontierfellowship.com), a missionary organization that sponsors Christian missions around the globe. Niger is an arid country on the edge of the Sahara desert and is one of the least developed and poorest countries in the world. Christians make up less than 1% of Niger's population.





The network of six schools run by the
Evangelical Church of Niger has one
boarding school at Tibiri and five day schools.

The student population is growing and additional classrooms are needed. The roads in Niger are primitive and some students have to travel many miles each day. Their families consider this a small price to pay for an education, especially one supported by a scholarship.

## NIGER CHILD EDUCATION

In 2017, Hebron Presbyterian Church was given the opportunity to fund scholarships for children in Niger. One of our members had been to Niger and had told us that a \$200 scholarship would make a real difference in a child's life.

The congregation enthusiastically responded and donated sufficient funds for 23 children. In 2018, funds for 46 children were raised. In 2019 we sponsored 60 children. The need continues and we invite other congregations and individuals to join us in this ministry. We have so much and they have so little. Thank you for your consideration.

PROVIDING FOOD FOR HUNGRY STUDENTS IS IMPORTANT IN A COUNTRY WHERE MANY CHILDREN DO NOT KNOW FROM WHERE THEIR NEXT MEAL IS COMING. ONE BENEFIT OF THE \$200 SCHOLARSHIP IS AN INCREASED FOOD SUPPLY FOR THE STUDENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES.
